

DISCLOSURE ABOUT PARTICULAR CHANGES IN TEACHING STATUS IN ANOTHER STATE

Education (Queensland College of Teachers) Act 2005

Under section 72 of the *Education (Queensland College of Teachers) Act 2005* (the Act), if there is a change in an approved teacher's teaching status in another State the approved teacher (a person who is a registered teacher or holds a permission to teach) must give notice of the event to the Queensland College of Teachers (QCT) within 7 days after the change happens.

This obligation to give notice to the QCT includes where an approved teacher is registered in another State and their registration is cancelled or suspended in that State. It also includes if the approved teacher is employed in a State that does not register teachers and their employment is terminated by their employer because their employer finds the teacher not competent or suitable to be employed as a teacher.

The maximum penalty for failure to provide notice to the QCT is 40 penalty units (currently equivalent to \$4,000). Penalties also exist for a person who gives false, incomplete or misleading information to the QCT. This is currently a maximum of 50 penalty units (currently equivalent to \$5000).
